


Domestic Violence & Guns in Nashville

Firearms & Domestic Violence Risk

Abusers with firearms inflict the most severe abuse.

Abuser likelihood to murder increases 5x with access to a gun & 20x if they threaten or abuse with a gun.

TN is the only state in the country that does not require DV offenders to disclose who they dispossess guns to.



OFS Firearm Flagging

The Metro Nashville Office of Family **Safety or OFS** flagged a total 10,832 Order of Protection and DV Criminal Cases in 2020 for high risk indicators. 43% had evidence of firearms and 22% had evidence of both firearms and strangulation.

MNPD IAP & Firearms Risk Identification

The Metro Nashville Police Department (MNPD) uses the Lethality Assessment or LAP to screen intimate partner violence victims for their risk of being murdered. The LAP is recognized by the US Dept. of Justice as a "promising practice" in intimate partner homicide prevention and has been implemented throughout the country.



Of the 1,081 cases reviewed on Nashville's High Risk Intervention Panel in 2020. 72% involved firearms.



In 2020 MNPD administered 7,220 LAPs and 2,425, or 34%, screened in as high-risk.

Firearms & Domestic Violence Homicides


TN ranks 6th in the nation for homicides by firearm.

TN ranks 10th in the nation for the rate that men murder women.

60% of 2020 DV homicides in Nashville perpetrated with a firearm

DV Firearms Homicides in Nashville increased 13% from 2019 to 2020.

Should Not Have Had Access to Firearms

From 2018-2020, 42% of Nashville's DV Firearms Homicide perpetrator's had past domestic violence or felony convictions. These convictions meant they were prohibited from owning or possessing a firearm by state and federal law.
